Introduction and framework

Varsha Foundation is running a 16 bedded home "सेह आश्रय" a short stay home called "Home Away from Home" (HAH) at Lucknow for children suffering from cancer and their families in partnership with Cankids...Kidscan since August 2019.

The HAH is fully functional with all household facilities and is providing services to the children undergoing treatment in the KGMU hospital. Cankids...Kidscan is an implementing partner and providing financial support as well as treatment and technical support services in the HAH.

Under the Project HAH, we are providing following facilities and services and ensuring:

- ➤ To provide outstation families with affordable, child appropriate accommodation during treatment
- > To Integrate project HAH into the treatment, care and support systems at the Hospital
- > To improving the overall standards of treatment & care
- > To provide atmosphere like home
- > To focus on individual hygienic cooking facilities and common dining areas to cater to the children's individual taste, failing appetites and need for healthy nutrition, which is vital for the success of their treatment
- > To focus on hygiene, proper storage of medicines, and information and support for proper follow up of Doctor's instructions
- ➤ To set up a school Room to ensure that children continue to receive education through Non-Formal Education Program.
- > To provide emotional and Psychosocial support, outings, recreational and community activities.
- > To provide transport facility between hospital and HAH
- > To provide cooking facilities
- > To provide administrative assistance
- Children are selected by Dr. Nishant Verma for HAH stay and Dr. Nishant Verma held responsibility
 Ms. Sangeeta Sahu but HAH coordinator now changed, this time held responsibility Mr. Sanjeev Yadav
 to send the children to the HAH once identified and finalized.
- 2) Eshwar Child Welfare Foundation and Satya Sai Sewa Sansthan Organization every week & regularly providing ration to the HAH.
- 3) Sangeeta Sahu from Cankids undertakes visits at HAH in weekly ensuring comfort stay of children and their families at HAH but now starting of June month the HAH coordinator changed this time Mr. Sanieev Yadav worked as HAH coordinator.
- 4) Annu Sharma Care Taker & Rohit Mishra Supervisor are available 24 hours in HAH for help to the families in every situation.



Precaution and necessary steps taken during 2nd wave of Covid-19 Pandemic

The second wave of this Covid19 pandemic has affected all and sundry including families were staying in HAH. 6 patients, 7 caregivers and Rohit Mishra our HAH supervisor also diagnosed Covid positive. HAH was in quarantine from 7th April to 20th April, it was a very tough time for our HAH but we never gave up, our children, caregivers and supervisor bravely fought Covid and recovered from Covid. We have 8 rooms with two bunk beds in our HAH but we kept only 1 family in 1 room. All Covid guidelines issued by Govt, doctors, Cankids and from HO of Varsha Foundation were followed properly. We are taking all necessary precaution to monitor and prevent the spread of Covid-19 in the HAH

HAH is equipped with following instruments & items to fight with Covid19.

- A. Battery operated spray machine and disinfectant solution.
- B. Infrared Thermometer
- C. Oximeter
- D. Glucometer
- E. BP instrument
- F. Hand sanitizer
- G. PPE Kit
- H. Gloves
- I. Masks
- J. Floor disinfectant solution
- K. Ambulance on call in case of any emergency

At HAH premises, the following care is being followed

We are taking every precaution to prevent the potential spread of the virus. The following protocols have been implemented in HAH:

- 1. Hand sanitizer is available at entrance area and patients/caregivers are instructed to use it on their arrival and departure.
- 2. It is mandatory for patients/caregivers to use face masks whenever they go out or enter HAH.
- 3. As it has now been declared a global epidemic, we are taking temperature and checking oxygen level every day in the morning and evening of all patients/caregivers.
- We recommend daily that patients and parents should avoid close contact with those who suffer from respiratory insufficiency.
- 5. On daily basis we ask them to wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom, before eating and after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty.
- 6. We also ask them to use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer provided to each family in HAH.



- 7. We recommend them avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth if they go out to hospital for treatment and it is advised that they should not join large crowds or gatherings.
- 8. Clean and disinfect frequently the touched objects and surfaces using a household cleaning spray or wipe.
- 9. We do disinfect E-Rikshaw daily before children and families board a Rikshaw.
- 10. We are screening all the patients/attendants before entering the HAH.
- 11. Outsider / visitors are allowed to visit the HAH but not more than two persons & Cankids team are allowed to visit the HAH.
- 12. Daily reporting to Cankids in prescribed format given.

It was biggest challenge in front of patients and families to arrange the fund for medicine, living, diagnostic, transport etc. in Covid-19 pandemic situation. Varsha Foundation came forward and immediate financial support provided to such patients and families who were in really needed the support to meet out their medicine, diagnostic, food, transport requirement.

Monthly summary of PPSA & MSF is given below:

PPSA support provided to the patients and their families:

April 2021: - Rs. 2400.00

May 2021: - Rs. 2700.00

June 2021: - Rs. 1800.00 (till 15 June)

Note: After Ms. Sangeeta Sahoo left new coordinator not handling PPSA hence PPSA support stopped.



MSF support provided to the patients and their families:

May 2021: - Rs. 22296.00

Weekly Sanitization of HAH Building

- ➤ We are doing complete sanitization of HAH building every week by spray machine and disinfectant solution.
- Main gate of building, walls and E-Rikshaws are sanitized on daily basis.













Play Room Activities & Diet Session by Dietitian cum Tutor

- After lockdown play room reopened mid of June Month & Ms. Pooja Gupta backed to work with additional responsibility of "Dietician cum Tutor".
- > She conducted awareness sessions with patients and families for maintaining hygiene in HAH.



- > Children were happier when playroom was re-opened for them.
- > Children spent good time in playroom, learned basic education, played with toys and educational toys and various items.
- > Tutor teaching basic education to all the children in playroom.
- > She also conducted drawing & craft activity for the children and children also happily participating in such activities.





Routine services by dietiatian

- Hygiene and sanitization in daily basis.
- Cleanliness check in Kitchen area as well as utensils.
- Nail cutting, hand washing, room cleanliness and self-hygiene practice for both patients and their parents.
- Awareness sessions conducted for Hygiene.
- Importance of cleanliness of hands during food handling.
- Importance of hygiene in cancer treatment.
- Nutritional Counselling and healthy dietary practice of patients (Diet chart provided by KGMU Hospital).
- Regular Follow-up with parents and patients in HAH for any query.
- Every week checked 24 hours of Dietary recall of patients (Chart filled by patient's attendants.)
- To keep monitoring patient's details like Height, weight, MUAC and haemoglobin.
- Combine session for group counselling.
